An update on the ladder truck by Chief Milton says that the parts are on the way but it's not fixed yet. Because of the older age of the truck it is hard to find parts. Also, the new volunteers are coming along with training and are getting to attend some fires as of lately for training experience.

On roll call Commissioners Edmunds, Hickman, Wise, Milton and Mayor Wollet voted "Yes."

Written motion was made by Commissioner Edmunds and seconded by Commissioner Wise to approve the application for Fatboy'z Pub & Grill Rt. 10 west. On roll call Commissioners Edmunds, Wise, Milton and Mayor Wollet voted "Yes." Commissioner Hickman voted "No."

NEW BUSINESS

On File – TIF Grant Agreement – Parking Lot – E. Adams St. up to 22,500 – Briefly discussing the subject, they would like to see all debris cleaned up at the site. Talking with Mr. Hammer about the plans for the development, he explained why debris is still at the site and told them the next building will coordinate with the décor of the first one. Staff looking at this agreement with some concern mainly because the TIF II District will be expiring in 2013.
